- Proof of 200 hours of voluntary community service. Please include the name of the organization(s), address(es), telephone number(s), and website(s). Also include the program or director’s name, contact information, and his or her signature.
- A letter of recommendation from a program coordinator/director of the organization for which you volunteered.
- College acceptance letter (if you are still awaiting a decision; the letter may be sent separately at a later date, but all acceptance letters must be received by May 1st).
